



SPECIAL OPTIONAL PROGRAMS FOR SENIOR CAMPERS

EQUESTRIAN

Boys and girls entering 4th through 6th grade who have an interest in horses will be excited about the new Equestrian Program. Campers will spend the majority of their week in a regular, gender specific, camp group. Three times per week, the Equestrians will leave their camp group and be bused to the stables to ride. They will receive riding instruction as well as participate in grooming and other horse related activities. Campers may be beginning, intermediate or advanced horse back riders.

RISING STARS

Budding young thespians will enjoy this coed program. Campers should be entering 4th through 6th grade. The Rising Stars participate in several hours of performing arts each day, concentrating on dance, drama, and music. While sports activities are reduced to compensate for the time spent in fine arts, campers swim twice daily and attend ropes course, arts & crafts, tennis, gymnastics, and other camp activities. The campers prepare a major musical production that is performed for parents and others in the community. Parts are determined by informal auditions. Even the minimum part will include at least 5 lines and participation in songs and dances. Rising Stars is an eight week program with limited enrollment.

YOUNG ARTISTS

Boys and girls who enjoy art and are entering 4th through 6th grade will love the newly revamped Young Artist program. Campers will spend the majority of their week in a regular, gender specific, camp group. Three times a week, the Young Artists will leave their camp group and join the young artists for extra art time (3-4 hours each week). Campers will experiment with different art forms and techniques, including ceramics, painting, photography, and drawing with charcoal. Children need not be experienced or gifted in art to be part of this group. They should, however, have an interest in improving their art skills.

EXPLORERS

Our four-week nature and water-oriented program is for boys and girls entering 5th or 6th grade. Campers participate in outdoor activities including canoeing, camping, orienteering, rock-climbing, rocketry, archery, outdoor cooking, and group initiatives. Explorers should be able to swim comfortably in water over their heads. In swimming, we emphasize safety skills in and around the water. Children have an opportunity to earn a Discovery Day Camp Water Safety Certificate. An important goal of the Explorer program is for campers to learn independent living skills; Explorers will participate in four exciting overnights. This program is limited to one group per session. The activities vary each session to allow the campers different experiences.
